Danish Embassy Art Prize is an annual prize-giving event for UK-based artists from Denmark. It aims to showcase emerging artists, and is open to recent BA or MA graduates from UK art programmes (last year of degree course or up to 24 months following graduation). Previous recipients of the prize include Eva Lerche-Lerchenborg, Ragna Mouritzen, Asger Harbou Gjerdevik, Christian Brehms, Maja Theodoraki, Robin Monies, Lars Birk, Wendy Plovmand, Mathilde Jensen and Janne Malmros.

The selection panel for this year's prize include Marie Nipper, Senior Curator at Tate Liverpool, Mads Damsbo, director of Brandts Art Museum and Barry Phipps, Director of Visual Art, The Møller Centre and Fellow, Churchill College, University of Cambridge. The recipient of the Danish Embassy Art Prize will be offered an exhibition at the Royal Danish Embassy in London for the duration of one year. As part of this, an opening reception will be organised for the artist. Furthermore, the recipient will receive £1000 towards the materials, installation and transport costs of their exhibition.

Entries should include an exhibition proposal, along with images of selected art works (max. 10 images) and a copy of your CV. All works must be wall mountable, i.e. paintings, graphic arts, photography, or alternatively reliefs and/or wall sculptures.

### **What is the Danish Embassy Art Prize?**

Danish Embassy Art Prize has held its annual art event for UK-based artists from Denmark since 2009. It is an event open to Danish BA and MA graduates at UK art programmes, in their last year, or within 24 months following graduation. The recipient will receive £1000 towards the materials, installation and transport costs of their exhibition.

The Royal Danish Embassy is located on Sloane Street, Knightsbridge in London.

### **Who is eligible to enter the Danish Embassy Art Prize?**

Danish Embassy Art Prize is an annual event for BA and MA students from Denmark studying at UK-based art programmes only. The applicants must be in their last year of degree course or up to 24 months following graduation

### **How much does it cost to enter?**

There is no entry fee for Danish Embassy Art Prize.

**What prize does the recipient of the prize receive?**

The recipient will be offered an exhibition at the Danish Embassy in London for the duration of one year. As part of this, an opening reception will be organised for the artist. Furthermore, the recipient will receive £1000 towards the materials, installation and transport costs of their exhibition.

**Do I retain the rights to my work?**

Yes. All entrants retain the ownership and copyright of all work submitted.

**Can I submit work that has been previously exhibited elsewhere?**

Yes. Entries can be sent that have been previously shown elsewhere.

**How much promotion will take place?**

The recipient of the prize will be announced and promoted on Facebook, Twitter and in the Embassy's monthly cultural newsletter. Furthermore, the recipient will be listed on the Embassy webpage along with previous recipients.

### **Can I change my entry once it has been submitted?**

No alterations can be made to submissions once they have been received.

### **Can I receive the dimensions of the exhibition space?**

### **What type of artwork can be submitted?**

Only wall mountable artwork will be taken into consideration, i.e. paintings, graphic arts, photography, or alternatively reliefs and wall sculptures.

### **How do I enter the Danish Embassy Art Prize?**

Complete the Application Form along with images of selected artworks (max. 10 images) and/or supporting sketches and a copy of your CV. The Application Form and CV must all be combined into one PDF file, and the images and/or sketches can be sent by sharing a Dropbox link. The PDF along with the link to Dropbox must be sent in an email to Anja Christiansen, Royal Danish Embassy, London [anjbch@um.dk](mailto:anjbch@um.dk) clearly marked "Danish Embassy Art Prize".

### **How do I attach high resolution images in an email?**

The easiest way to share high res images in an email is by sharing a Dropbox link.

1. Sign up for Dropbox.com. You can use up to 2GB of space for free.
2. Upload your files to your Dropbox.
3. Use the sharing feature on Dropbox to share a file or folder. Right click on the file and select "Share Dropbox link".
